Student Reports – Term 1 2024

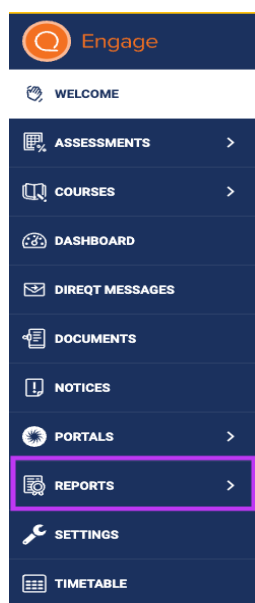
Dear Families,

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The student reports are an essential element in the partnership between teachers and families. I encourage you to contact curriculum leaders or individual teachers early in Term 2 if you have any concerns about your child's education. We also welcome you to attend our **Parent/Student/Teacher Evening on Wednesday 1 May (Week 1)** to meet with each of your child's subject teachers to reflect on their progress in Term 1. Booking information was sent out to families at the start of this week via email and can also be found on our [website](#) or via the SEQTA Family Dashboard.

Teachers use a range of different assessment strategies and tools to gather evidence of student achievement with reference to the achievement standards in the Australian Curriculum or performance standards of the SACE. Based on the evidence, teachers make an on-balance judgement to decide which grade best matches the standard the student has achieved. I thank the families who have entrusted their children in our care to educate them and help them to acquire the skills, capabilities and dispositions necessary to become independent thinkers and to gain a love of learning.

As we look ahead to Term 2, a reminder the school will be closed for the following dates:
